Jesus Arrested & Peter's Denials


John 18:1-27

When the mob took Jesus to high priest's house, the other disciple was able to follow Jesus into the courtyard, because he knew the high priest. But Peter had to wait outside.


Finally the other disciple came back, spoke to the servant girl on duty there and brought Peter in.
